June 2014

Wildlife Notes

Anne and I visited Northern Greece between 2nd and 16th June 2014. We took a package via Thomson's Small and Friendly brochure staying Bed and Breakfast at The Country Inn, Kallithea. Whilst there we hired a car for a week and during that time had a day around the Kassandria peninsula, a day in northern Halkidiki near Poligiros, and five days in Lake Kerkini National Park.

The Country Inn is located on top of coastal cliffs, a 10 minute walk from Kallithea and a 30 minute walk from Afitos. The lane to Kallithea was overgrown with brambles in flower which were alive with butterflies. We saw 18 species in this area supplemented by birds including Nightingale, Eastern Olivaceous Warbler, Sardinian Warbler and Red-backed Shrike.

We hired a car from Avis in Kallithea. A group A car through the Thomson rep. at a discounted rate (also from Avis) was E260. By booking direct it cost E219. We were allocated a Citroen C1 which was fine although a little underpowered on the hills having a one litre engine. On motorway inclines and hills we sometimes needed to drop down 2 gears and turn the air conditioning off! The up-side was that we did 795 kilometres and only used E77.69 of fuel. Petrol prices varied but averaged about E1.68 a litre. Diesel was cheaper at around E1.35 a litre but hire cars were petrol.

At Lake Kerkini we stayed for four nights at the Viglatoras Traditional Hotel in Ano Porroia, a charming village about 7kms from the lake and elevated on the lower slopes of Mount Kerkini. A superior room cost E70 a night B&B with a superb breakfast and a most helpful host, Stelios. We had some super recommendations for tavernas for our evening meals. We also met his wife, Philly, who is an English teacher so language wasn't an issue.

We experienced a wide range of weather during the two weeks. We started with overcast skies leading to 24 hours of steady rain. As the skies cleared the weather was then very pleasant with clear skies and warm nights. Daytime temperatures were in the high 20's. When we moved to Kerkini the temperature rose and during the day built to mid 30's by early afternoon. Here the evenings were very pleasant in the high teens. We finished as we started as on our last full day we had a tremendous thunder and lightning display before the heavens opened with a heavy downpour lasting five hours.

For wildlife research we used Steve Mills excellent site guide 'Birdwatching in Northern Greece' visiting most of the sites covered around the lake. We also used the internet, visiting www.birdwing.eu, and looked at various trip reports.

Highlights were:

A boat trip across Lake Kerkini into the mouth of the Strimonas River past the flooded forest. We were surrounded by thousands of Great and Pygmy Cormorants, Grey and Squacco Herons, Little Egrets, Great Crested Grebes and Spoonbills but the highlight was close encounters with both Dalmation and White Pelicans. We chose a trip from Kerkini Harbour and we had the boat to ourselves at a cost of E40.

We found a glade just out of Ano Porroia. We passed it after dinner as it was getting dark and found it alive with Fireflies sparkling everywhere. We even had one land on the windscreen continuing to flash it's light signal. Overhear Tawny Owls were calling and a Scops Owl was calling nearby. A magical moment but equalled when we drove past the same dell the following morning and the ground looked as though it was moving. We stopped to watch hundreds of Nettle-tree Butterflies on the ground and in the nettles at the edge of the glade.

Views from the lower slopes of Mount Kerkini were wonderful and in the open, flowery areas butterflies were superb. Good finds included Balkan Marbled White, Balkan Clouded Yellow and Eastern Baton Blue.

The flooded lakeside meadows between Kerkini and Lithotopas gave excellent views of Cormorants, Heron and Egrets in good light and reasonably close. We also found both Gargany and Ferruginous Duck here.

Last but by no means least was the lane from our Kallithea hotel to the village for the vast array of butterflies.

One lasting memory is that wherever we travelled we were accompanied by the constant singing of Nightingales. There must have been hundreds of them and all the nicer because they don't range as far north as our home in North Yorkshire.
